





LANCASTER COUNTY OVERVIEW

Lancaster County is located in South Central Pennsylvania along the Susquehanna River, approximately 70 miles west of Philadelphia. It is an area of just 984 square miles, houses a population of over 500,000 residents, and approximately 50,000 of them are under the age of 18. It is home to a diverse population with agricultural roots, a large Amish community, 60 municipalities, a third class city, and a strong sense of history.



Economic Impact

In 2023, direct visitor spending in Lancaster County amounted to \$2.6 billion, resulting in a total economic impact of \$3.4 billion when accounting for indirect and induced effects. This economic impact supported 25,679 jobs and generated \$242 million in state and local tax revenues.


The number of visitors to Lancaster County grew by 1.5% to reach 9.9 million in 2023. Although growth in overnight stays was somewhat tempered, day visitation saw solid increases. Additionally, rising consumer prices contributed to a 4.3% increase in visitor spending compared to the previous year.

Historical Sites

Historic Rock Ford: Edward Hand's 18th-century mansion, offers guided tours, gardens, and the John J. Snyder, Jr. Gallery. Located minutes from downtown Lancaster on 33 acres.

President James Buchanan's Wheatland: James Buchanan's 1828 residence, one of two Pennsylvania-born presidents' homes, offers guided tours, a stroll through the Louise Arnold Tanger Arboretum, and museum exhibitions from LancasterHistory, just west of Lancaster City.

Lancaster Central Market: The oldest continually running farmers market in the U.S. since 1730, offers a diverse selection of produce, meats, dairy, candies, and freshly made foods, as well as flowers and home goods.

The Ephrata Cloister: The historic Ephrata Cloister, founded in 1732, was a unique monastic community with original Germanic buildings. It served as a hospital during the American Revolution and now offers tours of its intriguing structures and grounds.

The Strasburg Rail Road™: Experience the Strasburg Rail Road, America's oldest operating railroad, dating back to 1832. Enjoy a historic steam train ride through Amish countryside and special events like themed rides. wine tastings, and Thomas the Tank Engine days for kids.

The Landis Valley Village and Farm Museum: The Landis Valley Village and Farm Museum, the largest Pennsylvania German museum, highlights the culture of 18th- and 19th-century German immigrants with tours, historical items, heirloom seeds, and themed events.
